IFAF 2017 SUBMISSION RULES AND GUIDELINES

ABOUT THE FESTIVAL

The International Institute for Indigenous Resource Management seeks submissions for the 13th Annual Indigenous Film & Arts Festival to be held in Denver, Colorado, October 4-9, 2017. The Festival showcases films by and about indigenous peoples from around the world. Our theme for 2017 is *Celebrating the Creative Spirit*.

SUBMISSION DEADLINE & ENTRY FEE

All submissions must be received by August 4, 2017. Entry fee for feature length films (30 minutes or longer) is \$20 (\$10 for full time students). The entry fee for short films (under 30 minutes) is \$10 (no charge for full time students). An additional \$5 processing fee is required for payments made in non-U.S. currency.

INDIGENOUS ARTISTS PREFERENCE

IFAF prefers to exhibit works by indigenous artists.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

Multiple entries will be accepted, but each entry must be submitted with its own Entry Form, Entry Fee, Agreement, and screening DVDs. Entries missing any of the elements below may not be considered for selection. We will not accept compilation DVDs.

CHECKLIST FOR SUBMISSION

- Completed Entry Form.
- Two projection quality DVDs for each work submitted.
- Filmmakers' bio (please include contact information, filmography, and tribal or indigenous community affiliation).
- Press materials, if available.
- Completed Agreement Form.
- Entry fee (as applicable).

SELECTION

The selection team of the Festival will select and invite all productions and media-makers at their discretion. Those selected will be notified via e-mail on or about September 8, 2017. We recommend that you confirm receipt of your entry via email to jeannerubin@iirm.org.

I understand that if the film identified below is selected for the 14th Annual Indigenous Film & Arts Festival, I must provide the following rights and warranties to the International Institute for Indigenous Resource Management ("Institute"):

- I agree that the Institute may screen my film at the Festival and may reproduce stills and or video clips from the film for the Institute website, Festival program and for promotional purposes.
- I agree that, if the film is selected, I hereby allow the Festival entry copies of my work to remain with the International Institute for Indigenous Resource Management for on-going research and preview purposes by researchers and by staff. This paragraph does not authorize additional public screenings.
- 3. I agree that these rights are granted to the International Institute for Indigenous Resource Management on a non-exclusive, royalty-free, perpetual basis.
- 4. I warrant that the use of the film for these purposes will not infringe nor violate the rights of any person or entity, that I have the sole authority to grant these rights, and that I have obtained all permissions necessary for me to grant the above rights, including permissions related to copyright, trademark, rights of publicity and privacy, and union contracts, and have paid any and all necessary fees for such permissions.
- 5. I agree to indemnify and hold harmless the International Institute for Indigenous Resource Management and the Indigenous Film & Arts Festival from any third party claims that may arise from the use of this film consistent with the rights that I am granting.
